The Police Department had another busy year. Officers continue the Community Policing philosophy, dedicating time to prevention and problem solving as well as enforcement. Here are some highlights:

Alcohol Education & Enforcement:

- Co-sponsored training on Standardized Field Sobriety Testing
- An ordinance was passed, changing the legal limit for breathalyzer from .10% to .08%
- Money from DWI convictions used to purchase a digital camera, and binoculars
- DWI Mini Grant from Mo. Division of Hwy. Safety for \$7,705 for PBT & Overtime
- Made 187 alcohol related arrests (up 41%); conducted 1 sobriety checkpoint and 7 saturated patrols

Community Interaction:

- Officers conducted approximately 40 meetings with various groups, contacting over 2,000 people
- Over \$5,000 raised for Concerns of Police Survivors in benefit football game in which *Officer Williams* participated
- Web page was reformatted; *Officer Kempen* continues to add new features; 3,490 hits in 2001
- *Officers C. Rector & Ross* discuss DWI with Leadership Camden County class

Drug Education & Enforcement:

- Co-sponsored training on Tactical Response to Methamphetamine Labs
- *Sgt. Beauchamp & Canine Nitro* dedicated over 200 hours and answered 60 calls to deter drugs
- *Officers B. Rector & Rensing* warn businesses of the items used to manufacture methamphetamine
- *Officer Kempen* touched the lives of 1,310 students with DARE & VEGA; graduating his tenth class
- Acting on a tip, *Officer Ross* arrests two Camdenton women & seizes nearly 100 grams of marijuana
- Made 83 drug arrests – down by 14% compared to 2000

Personnel & Employee Recognition:

- FAA thanks to *Sgt. Patrickus & Officer Rensing* for their help during plane crash investigation
- Wheatland resident sends thank you to *Sgt. Beauchamp & Officer C. Rector* for motorist assist
- *Chief Webster* was acknowledged as Special Olympics Volunteer of the Year; officers raised \$1,175
- The department welcomes new employees this year: *Carolyn Colliver & Todd Bithell*

School Resource Officers:

- *Officers Williams & Wright* started information line; kids did posters for awareness campaign
- SRO Officers instructed students on Alcohol, Drugs, Sexual Assault, Child Abuse, Violence
- Violent incidents at school up slightly (238 in 2001; 227 in 2000); only 2 violations of Safe School Act

Traffic Safety & Criminal Investigations:

- Officers receive \$8,800 from STEP grant to increase traffic enforcement; 1,414 tickets in 2001
- Aggressive Driving Campaign held August 14 & 15; used Speed Trailer from MSHP for awareness
- MoDOT changes yield lanes to be regulated by traffic signal
- Investigated 216 traffic crashes with 30 injuries & no fatalities (down slightly from 218 in 2000)
- Police step up enforcement on seat belt use (STEP Grant) and stop light violations
- Officers attended 371 hours of training specifically on Investigative Skills, a 32% increase from 2000
